2. We need to be persons for others: Jesus demonstrated the love of God, his Father, for us by living for us and dying for us. Let us remember that Christ's own love was not limited to the people he liked and, hence, that we should close our minds to thoughts of revenge.

Here's a question you probably haven't been asked in a while, if ever: **How are you doing with your burdens?** Family issues. The scourge of abortion. Inflation. Political unrest. We all have burdens that we carry. But what can we do about them? Jesus gives us the answer: Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. We can go to Jesus in many ways and one of those ways is through the Rosary. As Saint John Paul II said, "To pray the Rosary is to hand over our burdens to the merciful hearts of Christ and His mother." So in this Month of May, let's not only pray the Rosary but also spread the word of the power of the Rosary!
