Scripture lesson: The first reading presents Moses explaining the Law to the Israelites after his return from Mount Sinai. He tries to make the people revere and obey the Law given by God as something that will bring them dignity, purpose, and a unique place in history. He reminds them that keeping God's commandments will give them God's blessings of long life, prosperity, and peaceful lives. The Responsorial Psalm invites us to love God because He alone is our strength and our stronghold. In today's Gospel, a Scribe asks Jesus to summarize the most important of the Mosais Laws in one sentence. Jesus cites the first sentence of the Jewish *Shema* prayer: "Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God is Lord alone! Therefore, you shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength" (Dt 6:4). Then Jesus adds its complementary law: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Lv 19:18). Thus, Jesus says, true religion is loving God and loving our neighbor at the same time. It is by showing genuine, active love for our neighbors that we can demonstrate that we really love God.
